BCGBA WELCOME JOHN PARROTT MBE AS HONORARY PATRON

One of the country's top sporting stars has agreed to become the figurehead of crown green bowling's governing body, writes Steve McHugh.

John Parrott is widely recognised as a snooker great, winning the World Championship in 1991, and is now a pundit on the sport and also a member of the BBC's horseracing coverage team.

But one of his first loves in his native Liverpool was bowls. And he has now agreed to become Honorary Patron of the British Crown Green Bowling Association to try to help lift the game's profile.

Parrott, now aged 46, first started playing the game as a teenager with his father, Alan, at Wavertree Park in Liverpool, and showed such an aptitude that before long he reached the quarter-finals of the Junior Waterloo in Blackpool.

Once he picked up a cue he was bitten by the snooker bug, however, and his tremendous career in the game has been well chronicled.

But he has never forgotten his passion for bowls, and enthused: "It's a great game and needs more youngsters to start playing it. It

teaches competition and character, you've got the camaraderie of your team-mates, and there is so much more to it than people think".

He went on "It has in the past had the image of being an old man's game, but I've never really understood that, and believe that it's a great game for kids to take up. All you need is a pair of bowls, and then you can spend hour upon hour trying to improve. And who knows how good you could become?"

John finished by saying "The game has always been the same and anything I can do to help it along then I'd be delighted."

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP HOPING FOR A DRY DAY

The 2010 Club Championship will make its second attempt at completion when the County Champions return to Centre Vale Park (Burnley Road, OL14 7BS) in Todmorden at 10am on Sunday 13th March after last season's abandonment.

Torrential rain at the beginning of October caused severe flooding to the greens, particularly the green used by teams in Group 1 where play couldn't continue. The remaining greens managed to complete their First Round matches but with no let up in the persistent rain a decision was reluctantly made to call a halt to proceedings.

Holder, Lloyd Hotel (Cheshire), return with a 12 shot advantage over Llay Welfare (Wales) after three games completed in Group 1 while Fishwick Ramblers (North Lancs & Fylde) are 7 shots up on Nordley Liberals (Staffordshire) with just two games finished in the same group.

The eventual winners of Group 1 will play the winners of Group 3 in the semi-finals. Pudsey (Yorkshire), 1 shot winners over the 2001 champions Middleport Park (Potteries & District), take on Tonge (Greater Manchester) who won in 2008 and 2009, and received a walk over due to previous three-time winners Garswood Hall's non attendance.

In Group 2, Bradfield (South Yorkshire) will face St Georges (Shropshire) in Round 2 for a place in the semi-finals after they overcame Holme (Cumbria) by 7 shots and Onchan (Isle of Man) by 16 shots respectively.

Awaiting the winners will be the successful team from the all-Midlands clash between Kings Heath Park (Warwick & Worcester) and Highway Social (North Midlands) from Group 4. Kings Heath Park dispatched West Kirby Victoria (Merseyside) by 26 with Highway Social 13 shot winners over Littleover (Derbyshire).

MARATHON SESSION AT RULES REVISION MEETING

Representatives from each County Associations gathered at Winnington Park in Cheshire on a cold January morning for the Rules Revision Meeting.

The morning session is devoted to rules revision and, after a delayed start due to some technical difficulties, the Chairman, Gerald Merry, finally brought the gavel down ten minutes late to get the meeting underway which turned into a marathon session lasting over 3 hours.

There were 28 Notices of Motion to be heard and for any one to be declared 'carried' it must receive at least two-thirds of those voting.

Each County in membership, which includes the Isle of Man, British Crown Green Ladies and British Parks, received four votes each plus the vote of their Management Committee Representative. Past Presidents and Officers of the Association, with the exception of the salaried officers – CEO, Financial Officer and National Registrar – have the right to a vote also. This brought the total entitled to vote to 93 but was reduced by one after a representative had to leave the meeting.

Ten Notices of Motion were carried, eleven defeated, five were withdrawn and two failed to get a seconder.

Among those that received the two-thirds majority and hit the jack were:

- Counties can now include a County's insignia, player's name, Club insignia, sponsors insignia and / or manufacturers insignia on their shirts.
- If two Counties finish level on points scored and on aggregate in the group stages of the County Championships then the County with the highest number of shots for will qualify for the semi-finals. If it still remains a tie the number of individual winners throughout the Preliminary Group Stages will be taken into consideration with the County with the greatest number of winners proceeding to the semi-finals.
- Each County must now provide an after-match meal at their home venue following a County Championship match
- Each County Association shall be given the opportunity to host the Veterans County Championship which will be held in the county of the Immediate Past President on greens chosen by his / her County Association.
- Where disability or infirmity prevent a player from delivering jacks or bowls directly from hand then a mechanical aid, of a type approved by the Association, may be used to provide assistance.
- Standard Jacks are not to be stamped on more than four occasions. The first three, in date order, to be made on the bias side with the fourth and final one being made on the non-bias side. The expiry date on that stamp will indicate the year after which the jack is no longer legal.

Those that fell short included:

- The appointment of Officers will remain the responsibility of the Management Committee
- All references to an increase in fees, including the proposed annual £1 per player playing levy.
- A move to change the voting system to a simple majority
- A proposal to stop practice for either team in the County Championship
- The Junior Individual Merit will remain at 32 players instead of the proposed 64.

BCGBA CHIEF EXECUTIVE LOOKS BACK ON THE 2010 SEASON

The first competition in the BCGBA calendar of events in 2010 was the very popular **Jack & Jean Isherwood Veterans Championship** which was generously sponsored for the fourth year running by Grocontinental and played at Prees Cricket & Recreation Club near Whitchurch. The winner for the second time was Lancashire's Tony Rawlinson who produced an outstanding performance in the final against Cheshire's Gerald Merry.

The **Veterans County Championship** was played at the Severnside complex in Shrewsbury. The Group winners qualified for the semi-finals in which Cheshire defeated Wales and Shropshire beat a strong Yorkshire team. In a well contested final, with no individual score on either side less than 14, Cheshire defeated the host County. Unlike the previous year, I am sure that the result was, in part, due to the presence of the aforementioned Management Committee Chairman in the Cheshire ranks!

As usual, one of the highlights of the 2010 BCGBA calendar was the **Senior Individual Merit** which was played at Fleetwood Bowling Club and sponsored for the seventh year running by Padders feelgoodfeet. The very worthy winner was the remarkable Noel Burrows who, like good wine, seems to get better with age. I had the pleasure of witnessing his previous success in 1976 and, thirty four years later, at the venue where the very first BCGBA Senior Individual Merit was played in 1910, it was fitting and a tribute to Noel's powers of endurance that he triumphed in a memorable final against the pride of Derbyshire, Andy Spragg, himself back to back winner in 2006 and 2007.

The **Endsleigh Senior Supplementary County Championship** was played at Pilkington Recreation Club in Doncaster and culminated in an excellent final with a young Welsh side just getting the better of Derbyshire each team having four winners.

A week later, the **Drakes Pride Junior Supplementary County Championship** was played at Fulwood Conservative Club in Preston and produced an outstanding final in which Shropshire very narrowly defeated Greater Manchester.

The **Junior Individual Merit** was played at Burway Bowling Club in Ludlow and, as usual, provided an excellent day's bowling. Greg Smith, winner in 2008, took full advantage of the absence of the over-age Wayne Ditchfield to defeat Owen Jackson in the final which meant that there have only been two winners of the event in the last six years - a quite remarkable achievement by Wayne and Greg.

The **Endsleigh Senior County Championship** was won in amazing fashion by Warwick & Worcester who came from a mile behind to defeat Greater Manchester in a truly memorable final. I was at the appropriately named Forget Me Not Bowling Club in Birmingham where the last game had already finished to witness countless mobile phones relaying a bowl by bowl account of the final ends in Greater Manchester where Steve became the 'darling' of the Warwick & Worcester fans by scoring the necessary points. Congratulations to both sets of players and their supporters for providing a remarkable occasion which will live long in the memory.

A week later, the final of the **Drakes Pride Junior County Championship** was won by Yorkshire who recorded a comfortable victory against Wales. I travelled from Blackpool to the venue in Wales where there was an excellent atmosphere and some outstanding and very mature performances by players on both sides. As usual, the sponsors generously provided medals and bowls towels for the winners and runners-up.

The **Champion of Champions** was once again sponsored by Beryl & Don Cooke and, as usual, was one of the highlights of the BCGBA calendar of events. The final was a repeat of the 2000 final and a similar result with Chris Mordue (pictured) repeating his previous victory against Andy Spragg in an excellent final. Sadly, Beryl & Don have indicated that they will not be sponsoring the event in 2011 and I would like to place on record the Association's thanks for their generous sponsorship over many years which included the provision of shirts for all the players.

The **Club Championship** was played on the four greens at Centre Vale Park in Todmorden on the first Sunday in October. Or rather, it began on that date and at that venue but, in the interest of the safety of players and referees, play came to a very early end because of torrential rain which flooded the greens. The competition is now scheduled to be completed on Sunday 13 March 2011 at the same venue.

The final competition in the BCGBA calendar of events was the **Centenary Mixed Pairs Championship**, sponsored by my wife, Pat, and myself, and played at the adjacent Calderfield and Eton Bowling Clubs in Liverpool. In an excellent final the worthy winners were the Merseyside pairing of Lynsey Gorman and Terry Glover who defeated the favourites and previous winners, Lynn Pritchatt and Mel Evans.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP GETS A NEW NAME

Following discussions with the organisers of the British Team Championships played at Irlam Steel in Manchester at the start of each season, the BCGBA have joined forces with their Irlam counterparts to amalgamate the two competitions under a new name of the World Club Championship.

The new World Club Championship will continue to be played at Irlam Steel but will be organised by the governing body who will stick with the 32 team format played over four qualifying weeks culminating with a final eight teams.

Each of the 15 Counties have been invited to nominate two representatives who have won a cup or league competition from within their County during the 2010 season together with one representative from the Isle of Man and one from the British Parks CGBA.

Qualifying starts on Sunday 20th March and continues on Sundays 27th March, 3rd April and 10th April. The final eight teams will play to a winner on Sunday 17th April. Play gets underway at 11am on each date.

COACHES READY FOR A BUSY SEASON

Coaching is an integral part of any sport and the British Crown Green Coaching Scheme (BCGCS) members are gearing themselves up for the start of the new season. In addition to working within their own Clubs, many provide opportunities for children in schools and for members of their local communities to learn to play bowls.

At a time when Councils are faced with cuts and are looking at all areas in order to save money, we have a great opportunity to work with them. Green closures are a reality and the only way we have to retain many of our bowling facilities is by engaging with Local Authorities. Fortunately a number of them are trying to use their Development Officers to look for ways of getting more use out of the bowling greens. We need to be ready to step in and help.

In many areas, the BCGBA can supply qualified coaches to work with the Authorities to get more people into the sport. We are also working with the Bowls Development Alliance to promote our game, but we can do more. There are still some counties where coaches are very thin on the ground. We really do need more volunteers to come forward and train as coaches.

The BCGCS arrange both Coaching Seminars and Coach Training Courses with many Clubs taking advantage of this facility. Already, clubs and counties are arranging Full Day Coaching Seminars starting with:
